Class #1: Don't get into "TROUBLE" in life! Come join me for summer school as we dive into the real world with mathematics. We are going to learn how to plan for the future and gain knowledge that will help you land your first job, a house, and manage your money enough to even afford that fancy sports car!

Class #2: Take Me Out to the Ballgame: During this hands-on course, students will receive the unique opportunity to view athletics in a new way. Students will establish numeral value skills by using real-world sports statistics by developing your own sport's roster with a salary cap, compare statistics, etc..

Class #3: All About that GOOGLE: Don't be "SORRY" you missed out on this class. As our world advances into technology even more, why not learn more about it? In this course, you will learn how to use tools and add-ons in Google Docs, skills to enhance your Google Slides presentations, and learn how to create and design a Google Site! You will also learn how to explore Google Maps and Navigation which will come in quite handy in your driving years that is coming very soon!

Class #4: The Game of Life: Come learn about financial planning! Learn "LIFE" skills and how to buy cars, homes, and plan for vacation! You don't want to miss out on this fun and engaging class! You will also learn many skills in google sheets! This class focuses on technology in preparing you for life skills.

Taking CLASS 5, 6, or 7 for 2 weeks during Summer school will remove it from your regular schedule for the 2018-2019 year, allowing for another semester-long elective to be taken. Each class tells you when it's available in the description below:

Class #5: Careers: Students who are entering 8th grade may take this course the first 2 weeks. Students will explore various careers using Missouri Connections, guest speakers, and walking/bus trips to businesses in town. They will gain a solid understanding of their choices for careers, the education and/or training needed, budgeting, work values, creating a resume, and conduct during a job interview.

Class #6: PE: Students will participate in various activities that will allow them to remain active while learning to compete as an individual and as a team. This class is available to 8th graders the first two weeks and 7th graders the second two weeks.

Class #7: Health: Students will learn about their health in the optimum manner in the environment, the family, and society. The primary focus will be disease prevention and control, nutrition, environment and community health, consumer health, safety and first aid, mental health, family life, substance abuse. This class is available to 7th graders the first two weeks and 8th graders the second two weeks.

Classes on this list will only be available if enough interest is shown in each of them. Please indicate which course you'd like to take the first 2 weeks, or the second 2 weeks, or if you'd like to attend all 4 weeks. If you are taking courses for remediation because you didn't pass during the regular school year, please write "REMEDIAL" and the subject you need.

The Potosi R-3 School District is planning its summer education program. The following information is provided for students and parents to assist in making decisions about attending summer school:

- School will be in session from Tuesday, May 29 – Monday, June 25
- Students will attend all day – 8:00 a.m. to 2:50 p.m.
- There will be remedial and enrichment classes offered in order to best meet the needs of all students.
- High School students will have the opportunity to earn a full credit for attending summer school.
- Exciting learning activities will be provided.
- A specific enrollment will be required in order for a class to be offered.
- Lunch will be available.
- Transportation will be provided if there is enough interest at each site. There will be "pick-up" and "drop-off" sites **(There will not be door-to-door service.)** Parents will be required to get their child to the "pick-up site" each day. The bus will then transport the students to their designated school. Students will be dropped off at the designated "drop-off site" each day. Parents will be required to pick up their child on time at the "drop-off site." The following routes are being surveyed to determine interest:
