Taking any one of these classes during Summer school will remove it from your regular schedule for the 2019-2020 year, allowing for another semester-long elective to be taken, as long as you attend every day. Each class tells you when it's available in the description below:

**Class #1: Careers for incoming 8<sup>th</sup> graders:** Students who are entering 8<sup>th</sup> grade may take this course the first 2 weeks. Students will explore various careers using Missouri Connections, guest speakers, and walking/bus trips to businesses in town. Field trips such as the courthouse, bank, pharmacy, police station, etc are part of this class. Students will gain a solid understanding of their choices for careers, the education and/or training needed, budgeting, work values, creating a resume, and conduct during a job interview.

**Class #2: PE for incoming 8<sup>th</sup> graders:** Students will participate in various activities that will allow them to remain active while learning to compete as an individual and as a team. This class is available to 8<sup>th</sup> graders the first two weeks.

**Class #3: Health for incoming 7<sup>th</sup> graders:** Students will learn about their health in the optimum manner in the environment, the family, and society. The primary focus will be disease prevention and control, nutrition, environment and community health, consumer health, safety and first aid, mental health, family life, substance abuse. This class is available to 7<sup>th</sup> graders the first two weeks.

**Class #4: PE for incoming 7<sup>th</sup> graders:** Students will participate in various sports, games, walking, and more, which will allow them to remain active and compete as an individual and as a team. This class is available to 7<sup>th</sup> graders the second two weeks.

**Class #5: Health for incoming 8<sup>th</sup> graders:** Students will learn about their health in the optimum manner in the environment, the family, and society. The primary focus will be disease prevention and control, nutrition, environment and community health, consumer health, safety and first aid, mental health, family life, substance abuse. For 8<sup>th</sup> graders, this class is available the second two weeks.

If you are taking courses for remediation because you didn't pass during the regular school year, please write "REMEDIAL" and the subject you need.*
